1. The empathetic concern of the College for the differently-abled persons is very evident in the measures taken for helping them. The room adjoining to the Reception is set aside for accommodating them as it is nearest to the ramp.
2. User friendly wash basin is also fixed in the bathroom attached to this room and a cot is also provided. These facilities provided in close proximity to the ramp will reduce the strain and help them settle comfortably.
3. A separate notice board is provided for them to get informed of the information placed on the general notice boards. A wheel chair is also made available for them. Mobility aids like walking stick and crutches are also kept within reach.
4. The College has made a list of scribes readily available for those who cannot write the university examination on their own. These scribes are well trained to help the differently-abled to have a cheerful disposition in the examination hall.
5. Of all the facilities made available so far, the most important one is the willingness and the readiness on the part of the College authorities to shift a class from any floor to the ground floor for the benefit of those who cannot manage staircase.
6. Mrs Bijly Thomas, the supporting staff, is the Assistive Personnel who is assigned the duty of giving them care and attention with all the resources available on the campus. She has been given training in dealing with the differently-abled persons by Fr Rijo Karikkattil, Director, Health Dialogue, Calicut.
