ESL Activities

1. Speak about dream vacation.

Skill focus: Speaking

Advanced ESL speaking activities can be really fun for students if one knows what they like to talk about. In this case, project a map of the world on the board and ask students to think about where they would like to go on a dream vacation.

- **Programme aims:** Phonetics, vocabulary
- **Materials needed:** Map of the world, preparation questions, sample questions for discussion.

2. Get published in a magazine.

Skill focus: Writing

English learners love a good competition; why practice writing without a reason behind it? Before handing out the writing task, let students know how much time they have to preparation, how much time they have to write, and WHY they are writing.

- **Programme aims:** Grammar, vocabulary.
- **Materials needed:** Sample prompt or sample questions.

3. Plan a holiday.

Skill focus: Listening

Have the students listen to a clip of two people discussing their upcoming vacation plans. Prepare some key questions for them to answer to check on their comprehension. The students then can come up with their own ending and share their ideas with the class.

- **Programme aims:** Vocabulary, listening comprehension
- **Materials needed:** Audio clip based on a vacation or any topic your students enjoy, prepared questions, pencil, paper

4. Read a travel guide.

Skill focus: Reading

Pick an article for the students to read. Only give them the middle section and leave out the introduction and conclusion. To check on detailed comprehension, create questions about the article based on some of its key highlights.

- **Programme aims:** Vocabulary, reading comprehension
- **Materials needed:** Travel article, prepared intro and conclusion options, additional questions.

5. Answer "If I had a million dollars, I'd..."

Skill focus: Grammar

A fun activity would be to have the students sit in a circle. The teacher leads and says: "If I had a million dollars, I'd go to Paris." The next student says, "If I went to Paris, I'd eat lots of fruits." The students go around in the circle and create a story based on conditional phrases that the student before them said.

- **Programme aims:** Grammar, vocabulary
- **Materials needed:** Flashcards or pictures with different situations for samples, prepared materials with different conditionals.

6. Guess the word.

Skill focus: Vocabulary

One student draws a word and describes it without saying the word. The other students compete to guess the word. Continue playing until all of the words are finished. Whoever guesses the most words wins!

- **Programme aims:** Vocabulary, phonetics
- **Materials needed:** Planned vocabulary material cut out on different pieces of paper

3. Webinar on “*Research Nuances and Subtleties in English Literature: An Easy Way to Break Hardships.*”

On 20th January, 2021 a webinar online was conducted on the Google meet platform under the chairmanship of an eminent faculty , Mr M Anton Pushparaja from the esteemed Loyola college, Chennai. 





7. *Quiz Competition*





PROSPER IN LIFE WITH ENGLISH LANGUAGE

The United Nations observes April 23 as English Language Day every year. The setting aside of this day as 'English Language Day' is an appropriate tribute paid to the English language's renowned playwright, William Shakespeare who still has a profound impact on modern English. The period of his creativity with language which blossomed in 16th and 17th centuries witnessed a lot of changes and he contributed hundreds of new words and phrases that are still in vogue. In 2010, the UN Department of Global Communications established language days for each of the world body's six official languages. The avowed aim of celebrating an official languages day was to punctuate "multilingualism and cultural diversity." The UN official languages apart from English include Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish. The English Language happens to be the most popular spoken language in the world with more than 1.75 billion speakers around the globe. The story of the English language began in the fifth century when Germanic tribes invaded Celtic-speaking Britain and brought their languages with them. Later, Scandinavian Vikings invaded and settled with their languages too. In 1066 William I, from modern-day France, became king, and Norman-French became the language of the courts and official activity. People couldn't understand each other at first, because the lower classes continued to use English while the upper class-

es spoke French, but gradually French began to influence English. An estimated 45 per cent of all English words have a French origin. By Shakespeare's time, Modern English had developed, printing had been invented and people had to start to agree on 'correct' spelling and vocabulary. England and other European countries vied one another for territorial expansion by establishing colonies in Africa, Asia, the Americas and Oceania. By degrees, the British colonies began to free themselves from the political imperium with English being established in their institutions. Many great writers from the colonies had started making literary documents in various genres and talking about justice, equality, freedom and identity from their own eyes. The variegated forms of English formed through this history of colonization are called World Englishes. The English that is used and developed by everyone all over the world is christened as 'International English'. The English which once enjoyed the ivory-tower complacency is brought down to the terra firma of mundane everyday life. Mark Twain rightly observes: There is no such thing as the Queen's English. The property has gone into the hands of a joint stock company and we own the bulk of the shares! 'The Language Day' is observed by organizing various events such as book-reading events, English quizzes, and poetry and literature exchanges coupled with other activities that give a fillip to English language. The celebrations of the day for 2021 rivet on Africa where English is spoken in about two dozen African countries as an official language or widely used in education, administration, law, business, mass media and literature. Kudos to 'The English Language Day'.









13. A workshop on video editing

A one day workshop was conducted by the Department of English on **Video Editing** on 3rd May 2021 with the aim of making the students professional with basic journalistic skills. Nivin John, a former student of Navajyothi College was the resource person. And he was studying his Post Graduation from Kannur University Campus. The students from Department of English participated in the workshop. The introduction of the editing software *Adobe Premiere* was the key function of the workshop. The following are the points he highlighted.

Thrust Area in a Nutshell

Video editing is the process of manipulating and rearranging video shots to create a new work. Editing is usually considered to be one part of the post production process — other post-production tasks include titling, colour correction, sound mixing, etc.

Editing means:

- Rearranging, adding and/or removing sections of video clips and/or audio clips.
- Applying colour correction, filters and other enhancements.
- Creating transitions between clips.

The Goals of Editing

There are many reasons to edit a video and your editing approach will depend on the desired outcome. Before you begin you must clearly define your editing goals, which could include any of the following:

Remove unwanted footage

This is the simplest and most common task in editing. Many videos can be dramatically improved by simply getting rid of the flawed or unwanted bits.

Choose the best footage

It is common to shoot far more footage than you actually need and choose only the best material for the final edit. Often you will shoot several versions (takes) of a shot and choose the best one when editing.

Create a flow

Most videos serve a purpose such as telling a story or providing information. Editing is a crucial step in making sure the video flows in a way which achieves this goal.

Add effects, graphics, music, etc

This is often the "wow" part of editing. You can improve most videos (and have a lot of fun) by adding extra elements.

Alter the style, pace or mood of the video

A good editor will be able to create subtle mood prompts in a video. Techniques such as mood music and visual effects can influence how the audience will react.

Give the video a particular "angle"

Video can be tailored to support a particular viewpoint, impart a message or serve an agenda.
