




INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR OLDER PERSONS




A SELFIE WITH MOTHER




MOTHER'S DAY: AMMAYOODOPPAM


READING DAY (2019-2022)







READING DAY: VIDEO PRESENTATION

“Helping others is the way we help ourselves”



CAMP REPORT – ‘DISHA’

DECEMBER 2019

21.12.2019

Navajyothi College Cherupuzha NSS Seven Day Camp 'Disha' 2019 kicked off at 3 p.m. in Government Higher Secondary School with a beautiful parade of bands from all across Thirumeni Town. At 3 p.m., all NSS volunteers assembled in the school auditorium for the inauguration ceremony. Mr. Stenil George, Programme Officer, gave the welcoming address, and Mrs. Bindu Biju, Education Standing Committee Chairperson, Cherupuzha Grama Panchayat president, presided over the event. Mrs. Jameela Kolayath, President of Cherupuzha Grama Panchayat, gave the opening remarks. Dr. Shajimon T J (Principal of the College) gave an opening address, while College Director Fr. Jimmy Anjilithoppil addressed the audience. At 5 p.m., the meeting came to a close. The volunteers then drank tea. The youngsters were then sorted into five groups such as Gandhians, Chachaji, Rajaram, Amma, Ambedkar. of ten by former programme officer Rajeev PG .

The volunteers formed a wonderful fellowship and took over with a little levity. The camp was honoured by Fr. Abraham, Fr. Jimmy, Fr. Franco, Fr. Jijo, and Fr.



Anto. NSS volunteers arrived in groups after dinner at 8.30 p.m. and participated in a variety of art activities.

NSS volunteers who came to the camp for the second year also shared their camp experiences. Everyone had unique and inspirational experiences. The folk song by Arjun KV was the artistic highlight of the event. The first day of camp was then concluded with a camp review.

22/12/2019

The seven-day NSS camp is now in its second day, with the purpose of "personality development via community service." The NSS flag was hoisted to start the second day of festivities. Under the supervision of the master, yoga teacher Dr. K. Damodaran led the yoga instruction from 6 to 7 a.m.

The second day was then opened at 8 a.m. by Janakiamma of Thirumeni Colony, under the leadership of the Gandhians Group in charge of the

Committee.

Janakiamma was a wealth of information about therapeutic plants and herbs.



Rajeev PG, a former NSS Programme Officer, presided over the event. The volunteers began working around 9.30 a.m. The main initiatives included cleaning the school, planting organic vegetable gardens, and constructing garbage pits. We were able to complete the work beautifully by 1:00 pm thanks to everyone's cooperation and devotion. After lunch, the students were woken by Mr. Manoj K V (HOD, Department of Management, Pilathara Co-operative College). Fr. Tojus then conducted a session on



"Youth and Social Commitment" at 5 p.m. After the lunch, the cultural programme began at 8:30 p.m. The camp was visited by Mrs. Smrithi, Ms. Hema, and Ms. Rosmin. Seniors who attended the camp also spoke about their experiences. The meeting was called to order about 11 p.m.



23/12/2019

The third day of the seven-day camp was devoted to outdoor activities. The camp began at 6 a.m., as is customary. Mr. Madhu, a yoga instructor, raised the flag and began the class at 6 a.m. At 7 a.m., the yoga class concluded.

Following the meal, a farming class was held. Mr. Joshi was in charge of the class. He was also a photographer who demonstrated how to fit more veggies and fruits into a smaller space. The programme committee is overseen by the Amma Group. The camp report was provided in the morning part, and the camp newspaper was distributed. Then we drove to Chembalaimukku to work on road renovations. Mrs. Rosalie, a member of the 13th Ward and the Chairperson of the Development Standing Committee, gave a speech. The volunteers concluded their tasks and served a lovely supper for the students at Chembalaimukku with the support of locals and seniors. Everyone had returned to camp around 2.30 p.m.



Jidhesh Kampallur gave a class at 3.30 p.m. He gave a talk titled "Literature and a Democratic Society." Through games and singing, he made the class beautiful. At 4.30 p.m., the class finished. The balance of the time was spent on games and cleaning, and the cultural event began at 8

p.m., following the lunch. The cultural programme was led by the Chachaji Group.



Everyone took part in numerous activities. At 10.30 a.m., the cultural event came to a close. The camp review was then presented by all the groups. The activities for the third day ended at 10.50 p.m.

24/12/2019

The river clean-up was completed successfully on the fourth day of the NSS seven-day camp. The river was cleared for about 800 metres. The river was partially cleansed thanks to the efforts of NSS volunteers.

Our day began with yoga, as is customary. Mr. Madhu taught a yoga class from 6 to 7 a.m. Volunteers gathered for a meeting after breakfast. There is a camp inauguration and a camp paper inauguration. The NSS volunteers go river cleaning



after the conference. We cleaned up the river with the help of the NSS unit. The river cleaning was completed with great



seriousness after collecting the debris in sacks and handing it over to the panchayat. The afternoon is dedicated to Christmas Eve preparations. On Christmas Eve, the






SNEHADEEPAM




HIROSHIMA AND NAGASAKI

KERALAPIRAVI


"A land with the appeal of captivating works of art"






POLICE COMMEMORATION DAY

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


OZONE DAY




INTERNATIONAL JUSTICE DAY- VIDEO PRESENTATION







QUIT INDIA DAY




WORLD SUICIDE PREVENTION DAY



“Speak up if you are worried! There is someone near you to listen, encourage and follow up”



"A winner is a dreamer who never gives up"



Our flag does not fly because the wind moves, it flies with the last breath of each soldier who died protecting it.



Being safe is the first and foremost thing for all of us.


