


How much of the syllabus was covered in the class? 263 responses






# How well were the teachers able to communicate? 263 responses






r's approach to teaching can best be described as

Was your performance in assignments discussed with you? 263 responses




Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers. 263 responses








The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.






What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.
